Topic: The class provides the most up-to-date information pertaining to all the cannabis strains, the signs of impairment and field sobriety test studies. The class starts by reviewing the NJ cannabis laws and how it affects current police procedures. We then discuss the evolution of the cannabis flower and its increasing strengths, hash, hash oils, the several synthetics and various concealment paraphernalia such as vapes. I continue into the signs and symptoms of cannabis and what an officer may see on the motor vehicle stop. We talk about the 5 ng/ml concept and how it cannot be used to determine impairment. Lastly, we review recent studies to show how cannabis affects the person's ability to operate a motor vehicle safely, a proper demonstration of field sobriety tests and what clue signs you will see with someone impaired with cannabis.

This class is for **all patrol officers** who want to learn from the most up to date information and studies on how to establish **probable cause** when they encounter a subject under the influence of cannabis.
